- Remove hay from diet slowly over a period of five days minimum when using as a complete feed.
 - Divide daily feed into two or three equal feedings. Feed at the same times daily.
 - Adjust amount fed according to desired body condition. Raise or lower daily feed at a maximum rate of one pound daily.
 - Change feed programs gradually over a period of 7 to 10 days.
 - Feed horses in troughs with large bottoms placed at the normal head height or lower. Prevent rapid eating.
 - Delay feeding horses which are hot, excited, stressed or show signs of illness such as diarrhea or fever.
 - Consult your veterinarian regularly to have your horses examined for parasite control, proper care of teeth and other general horse health care.
 - Keep clean, fresh, cool water available at all times.
 - If horses have been receiving hay or pasture and you wish to stop offering hay or pasture, remove hay and/or pasture from the daily feeding program only after you have fully switched to this feed.
- CAUTION •••
- DO NOT use feed that is old, molded or insect infested.
 - Examine feed daily before using to ensure freshness.
 - Keep feed fresh by storing in a cool, dry place.
 - **DO NOT feed to sheep or other copper sensitive animals.**
